- Identify the importance of teamwork in the success of wilderness medicine and wilderness activities in general.

- Recognize the importance of physical fitness and its impact on the execution of health care provider duties, especially in a wilderness setting.
- Review the potential influences and complications of uncontrolled environmental conditions and settings on the management of wilderness medical situations.
- Develop bonds of collegiality between participants from different schools, hospitals, professionals, areas and backgrounds.
- Obtain a familiarity with references and resources for self-education and further development of wilderness medical education.
- Develop a deeper sense of respect for the environment and the need for proper management and conservation of wilderness areas.
